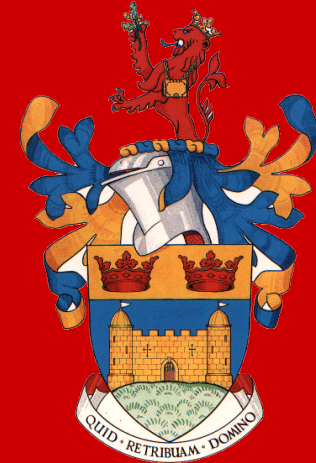

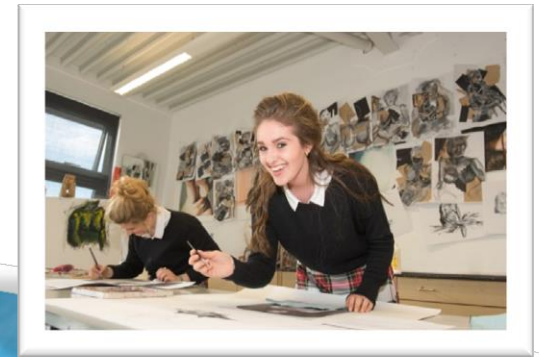

Time Frame

- 'Early Applications' CFD to continue to work with and hand in 30th September
- AA will work with students through July and September with 31st October as 'advised' hand in.
- Final deadline to reach UCAS by deadline 18th November

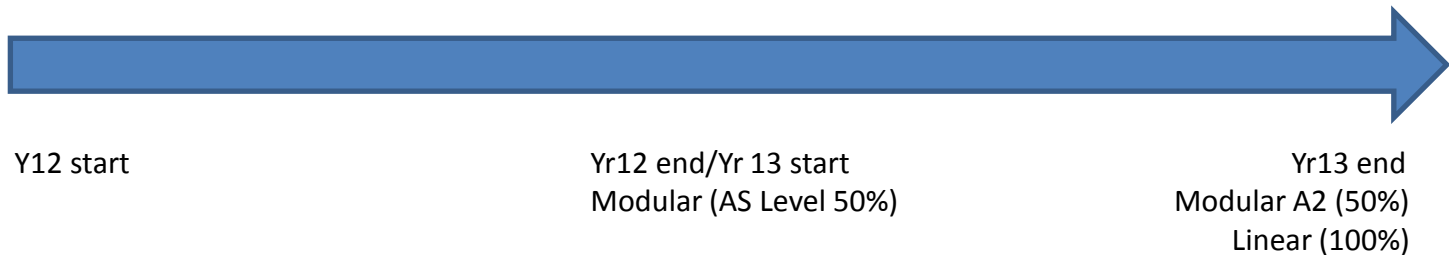

KJS Sixth Form Curriculum Reform

- AS Level grades will go on the UCAS application
 - These grades will inform which courses are applied for
 - We also add A Level predicted grades and an academic reference
 - Very strong applications
- 

UCAS Tariff

A Level	Current	New
A*	140	56
A	120	48
B	100	40
C	80	32
D	60	24
E	40	16

Tariff

- For 2016 entry and 2017 course start
- About 1/3 courses use a tariff
- As Level now 40% of A Level (was 50%)

Other changes from curriculum reform:

- Holistic application important
- Aptitude test for Oxbridge

Direction from 2016 - KJS

- Increased number of interviews
- Unconditional offers with a caveat
- Far and wide applications – excellent!
