### **Personal Development**

'Thought for the Fortnight' is a new activity that will be a focus in all 3 Key Stages during Tutor Time.

The aim of Thought for the Fortnight is

- to encourage students to think on a deeper level & promote discussion
- to encourage students to think about and discuss their self-development
- to encourage students to display an acceptance of others lifestyles and beliefs
- to challenging stereotypes
- to provide an opportunity to promote the school values and values that are important to the wider community

Thought for the Fortnight for the weeks beginning 9th and 16th September is "You are who you are around ". We encourage parents and carers to open discussions at home linked to the Thought for the Fortnight. You may want to talk about what message the quote is trying to get across, why it is important and how it can be applied to everyday life.

The key messages we want students to take away from these discussions are:

- The people we spend most of our time with impact on how we think about things, how we act on things and on the decisions we make on a daily basis.
- You need to surround yourself with people who will help you achieve your goals, support your beliefs, and are the kind of people who you want to be.

### Assemblies

Year 7, 8 & 9 – Learning Expectations delivered by Mrs Eastaugh. This assembly is linked to the school value of ENGAGED and focuses on 'Set no limits on what we can achieve', homework, presentation, outstanding work and additional reading.



Year 10 & 11 – Learning Beyond the Classroom delivered by Miss Baker. This assembly is linked to the school value of ENGAGED and focuses on opportunities students have to develop themselves by becoming involved in opportunities outside of the classroom such as extra curricular clubs, enrichment trips, House events, leadership opportunities.

Year 12 – Studying at 6th Form delivered by Ms Watson. This Assembly is linked to the school value of ENGAGED and focuses on study skills and activities which can be completed outside the classroom as an essential element of 6th Form study.

Year 13 - Post 18 Planning & Preparation delivered by Mr Chruchill. This assembly is linked to the school value of READY and focuses on applications for university, apprenticeships, & jobs plus planning for the 'next step' beyond KJS.



### Measles, chicken pox and shingles

Please ask for may we your cooperation in vitally important matter? One of а pupils is receiving medical treatment for cancer. our This puts the pupil at serious risk if exposed to measles, chicken pox or shingles. The best way to protect a pupil from measles is for all pupils to be immunised against measles. Please discuss measles immunisation with your GP if your child is not already vaccinated. If you suspect your child has measles you should let school know immediately.

Our pupil is also at risk from chicken pox and would need to be given an injection within three days of contact. Please let us know immediately if you suspect that your child has chicken pox. It is also very important that you let us know if anyone in your household has shingles.

Your own child is not at any risk whatsoever from this situation. However, the health and wellbeing of our pupil with cancer may be at serious risk. We depend on the cooperation of all parents amd know that we can rely on your help.

### Uniform

Thank you for supporting the high standards we expect of our students' uniform. They have come back looking extremely smart, which is fantastic, a great start to the year!

We do still have an issue with eyelashes and false nails, however. In line with the planner, can I draw your attention to page 14 please and these rules particularly:

- No false eyelashes
- Nails should be an appropriate length. Acrylic, gel nails and nail varnish is not permitted

We have tried to work with students and be reasonable regarding eyelashes, allowing students to wear discrete lashes, but unfortunately this is not working. To assist and provide clarity for both parents and students, we feel the guidelines need to clear and not open to interpretation. We have students who have extreme false eyelashes or extensions which are unacceptable for a school setting.

We have therefore decided that, from Monday 23rd September, we will not allow any form of false eyelashes or extensions. Hopefully this will give enough time for students and parents to make any necessary arrangements and adjustments, so that from Monday 23rd September, we have clarity, fairness and consistency for everyone.

Please could you make sure that any lashes or extensions, including those professionally applied, are removed by then. This will ensure that from that date we will not need to make any parental contact regarding this area.



### **Rotary Young Leader's Award**

Earlier this week, two of our year 13 students, Lewis Jauncey and Tom Gill, gave an excellent presentation to Knaresborough Rotary Club on their Rotary Young Leaders Award (RYLA) course experience.



 ${\it Rotary International } is one of the largest$ 

service organizations in the world with the mission to "provide service to world others, promote integrity, and advance understanding, goodwill, and peace through the fellowship of business. professional, and community leaders". The course allows young people to experience at first hand the challenge of leadership. This course is open to young men and women who are over 16 at the start and under 18 on the day the course concludes.

The course contains a mixture of physical and mental challenges that allow participants to experience leadership, team building, communication, and problem-solving skills. After every activity, the teams are given the opportunity to evaluate their performance and gain feedback, at an individual level, from a mentor. These are based on both indoor and outdoor activities including water activities, orienteering, raft building and presentations Rotary has been running these courses for over 25 years and has helped many young adults to develop their personal skills as a leader.

Rotary is proud of the system of helping to develop the leaders of tomorrow and looks forward to meeting and working with many more in the future. Applications open in the Spring so look out for the posters. The course also fulfils the residential section of the Gold Duke of Edinburgh's award.

## Teaching and Learning - homework and catch up

Our drive to raise achievement means that we set high expectations for our students. We expect our students to engage positively in their lessons and produce work of the highest standard. This also means that students need to ensure they do catch up work when they are absent so that they close their knowledge gaps and complete homework to the best of their ability. Homework is set on Bromcom so that both students and parents can access this from home. Please support your child to download the Bromcom student portal app using the QR code as shown below. If your child has problems logging onto the app please ask them to see the IT technicians for support.

Year 7 students are being taught how to do this in their IT lessons. All other students have been given instructions about how to this last year.

1. Download 'Bromcom Student app' using the relevant QR code shown

2. Create a 5 digit pin code that you will need to remember 3. Select to use a Magic Link and type in the School ID 11433

4. Enter your email address e.g. 24asmith@king-james.co.uk5. Now open your school email on the same device and verify the link
