It is linked to the assemblies which focus on protected characteristics that are being delivered to all students the week beginning 24th March.


The Key Takeaways are:

Assemblies next week are being delivered by Mr Phillips (Student Health and Wellbeing Co-ordinator) and students will have the opportunity to watch Teachers Talk Part 2.

Teachers Talk Part 2 is a continuation of our wellbeing video series that was well received by students. The first part focused on staff openly discussing mental health, which had a fantastic impact on students, helping them see that everyone faces challenges and that it's okay to talk about wellbeing.

For Part 2, we are focusing on small, everyday actions that can improve mental health. This video will feature staff sharing activities they do outside of work that support their wellbeing—whether it's going for a walk, spending time with pets, reading, or simply catching up with friends. By showcasing this, we hope to inspire students to reflect on their own routines and find simple ways to boost their mental health.

Fully Booked!

As a reading school, we strive to inspire our students to keep reading for pleasure and have the confidence to embrace new opportunities. Our annual literary festival 'Fully Booked! A Celebration of Reading involves the whole school in sharing stories, celebrating authors, illustrators, creative writing and most importantly having fun.

This year, we were delighted to welcome Regie Rigby, a literacy consultant and owner of Destination Venus, a comic store in Harrogate. Regie combines his experience as a teacher with his love and interest for comics to lead creative workshops in which students are introduced to comic creation. Our students learned about some of the history of comic books, the challenges and successes of published authors, and what it is that makes drawings become a comic. Students were tasked with creating their very own comics, and we were treated to some incredible artistic talent, fantastic storytelling, and brilliant comedy.

It was also a pleasure to welcome back a former KJS student, Rowena Lloyd, to run a series of workshops exploring the Knaresborough Castle Riot. Rowena is the Director of Yorkshire CREATE which offers opportunities for people of all ages and skill levels to explore and develop their creative talents. Students were introduced to the history of the riot through what little facts and documents exist, as well as personal writings of some of those involved. They then used these facts to craft their own creative writing pieces from the perspective of someone at that time. There were some wonderful ideas explored by the students, and they did an amazing job of considering the feelings and motivations of the people involved.

Rowena will use the work and ideas presented by our students to contribute to a performance happening at Knaresborough Castle entitled "The Knaresborough Eleven" on Saturday 10th August.

There was also a wide range of engaging departmental activities throughout the week. For example, the maths department read aloud excerpts from Rob Eastaway's 'How to Take A Penalty' introducing our students to the hidden mathematics of sport. In drama, listening to an extract from 'Sweeney Todd' provided our KS3 students with the perfect introduction into their new topic of Victorian Theatre.

Many of our students have taken part in the multiple competitions on offer. The entries to the 'Dress Your Potato' competition have ranged from individual characters to entire scenes and the creativity and craftmanship on display is inspiring. For the 'Graphic Novel Bookmark' competition we have seen a mixture of genres in the 4-panel comic template and some of the most vibrant and spectacular colouring ever!

Our lunchtime extracurricular events were led by students, and it was wonderful to see their confidence grow as they were planning and leading the sessions. Overall, it was such an exciting week which sparked some great discussions and got our students talking more about reading. See the next page for more photographs.

will be a few difficult conversations ahead, but they will always be done with the goal of obtaining an outcome in everyone's best interest.


One of our Year 9 students, Euan A, performed in Harrogate Festival on piano last weekend and achieved really highly in his class.
