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
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Message from the Headteacher

As parents we have a duty of responsibility to ensure that we set appropriate parental controls that restrict the content available to your child, and that you frequently check your children's devices, which includes smart TVs and games consoles, as well as mobile phones and tablets, to ensure that you know who they are in contact with and what they are doing online.

The assembly is linked to our school value of RESPECT, raising awareness of the annual day of remembrance which honours and remembers the bravery, sacrifice, and dedication of those who have served and continue to serve our nation.



Rewards

As a school we understand the importance of shaping positive behaviour, which comes from a balance of high expectations, well communicated boundaries and consequences, strong relationships and acknowledging those students who make those positive behaviour choices. We have listened to both parental and student feedback and therefore feel the need to recognise those students who consistently get it right day in, day out. We want our students to know that their contributions in making King James's a happy and safe place to learn are recognised and appreciated by us all.



Starting next Half Term, school will be automatically allocating a maximum of fifteen positive recognition points each week to our students who are consistently demonstrating our key values of READY, RESPECTFUL and ENGAGED. These points will be automatically generated, by our system, and you will be able to view these by logging into MCAS.

Attendance at school every day is a proven contributor to academic success and so, as we recognise how well our students are learning, we are awarding one recognition point each day they are in school and a maximum of five to those students who have 100% attendance in a week.

We encourage students to be punctual both to school and to all lessons, to reduce lost learning time and support every child in reaching their potential. We will therefore award students with one recognition point each day of the week if they are on time to school and all of their lessons.

To raise expectations further any students who do not receive any negative points, including for uniform, homework, and equipment, will be awarded with one recognition point each day of the week they receive no negative points.

We will take every opportunity to celebrate those students who are demonstrating the King James's values, and will continue to seek the views of our students through our student council meetings on how we will celebrate the accumulation of these points at the end of each Learning Cycle.

Book Clubs

Reading is an essential skill, not just for school but for life. As a Reading School, it doesn't matter at King James's whether we are in the classroom or the lunch queue, we just love to chat about books!
