

LIBRARY NEWS




We hope you are all looking forward to starting at King James's School in September. Here is what we have been getting up to in the library, along with a few things planned for the summer holidays and the new term in September.

We also love to reward effort and achievements in reading and will host AR award ceremonies throughout the year to celebrate. Trophies, awards and prizes are up for grabs to those of you who demonstrate a positive attitude towards reading, resilience, and even for reading **one million** words!

There is also the house trophy which is awarded to the house which collectively reads the most words.

Skrentny Creative Writing Competition




Battle of the Books



We offer you many ways to enjoy reading, from relaxing on a beanbag with a physical book, to eBooks you can read anytime outside of school.


myON
